Update for District Planning Committee Meeting Fiber Line & Nurse's Office

Two separate bids will be received Tuesday, one for the Data and the other for the Nurse's Office.

Capital Project Overview

Update of work over the previous 2 months.

- Hazardous Materials Testing was completed by Ambient Environmental. Abatement Drawings are 95% complete.
- The Geotechnical Report was completed 9-12-2014. There were no conditions that required exceptional foundations. Information is used to design the water runoff retention structures.
- Day Automation was selected by the District in August 2014 to provide temperature controls and security systems planning and management.
- Infrared Roofing Scans were prepared August 12th to access existing roof conditions below the membrane.
- Coordination has and continues to occur between Delaware Engineering and C&S Companies for the sanitary sewer tie-in. To date this has been very smooth.
- C&S Companies is preparing an "Abandonment Report" for DEC's review for septic filter removal. Once the work is done a SPEDES Permit will no longer be required.
- Beginning in June 2014, multiple coordination meetings occurred to review project scope and costs. A 90% complete set of drawings was reviewed by the consulting team Wednesday, October 22, 2014.

Capital Project Outlook

- Project Schedule: SED is reviewing the drawings for permitting. This process is expected to be complete by December 2014. Bidding is planned for January / February 2015.
- Turner Construction to determine Bid packages and confirm alternate bid scope.
- Construction Schedule: A detailed project schedule is being prepared by Turner Construction Corporation in coordination with the GCSD. Meetings begin Friday October 31st and a detailed schedule will be in place by the end of November.
