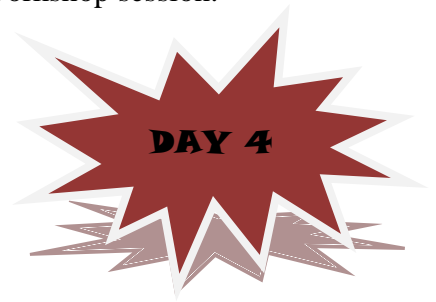

Description: Day 1: This two-day skills workshop is designed to help staff working with students who present diverse social, emotional or behavioral challenges. The verbal portion of this training prepares staff to use the power of the relationship to de-escalate the tension level of someone in crisis and avoid physical intervention whenever possible. The program integrates two models of thinking: 1) understanding the cycle of escalating behaviors and the different points along the continuum where students may be, so interventions can be targeted and based on the student's needs and 2) a self-awareness model, which identifies common triggers that staff need to be aware of so staff can monitor and control their own reactions in order to provide better care and defuse rather than infuse the situation. **Day 2:** This all day workshop continues the previous day's work in verbal de-escalation and introduces staff to Handle With Care© physical interventions techniques, effective documentation techniques, the Life Space Interview, and individual crisis plans. *Reminder ~ Participants: By invitation as determined by the Director of Special Education and Pupil Personnel Services*
