## Diploma Requirements cont.

- 📞 Students are recommended to have completed one unit of language by the end of their freshman year. Students are required to complete one credit of foreign language
- 📞 A three unit sequence in a language other than English, or a five unit sequence in business, technology or the arts

# Testing Required for Graduation

Students must demonstrate competency in reading, writing, math, science, US History and global studies by passing the examination listed below:

## Regents Diploma:

- Comprehensive English Regents exam
- Integrated Algebra Regents exam
- Global History & Geography Regents exam
- US History & Government Regents exam
- One Science Regents exam
- Second Language Proficiency exam
- RCT exams may be available for special education students who score below 55 on a Regents exam.

## Advanced Regents Diploma:

- Integrated Algebra, Geometry and Algebra II/Trigonometry Regents exams
- Additional Science Regents exam
- Second Language Proficiency Exam (or five credits in Technology, Arts or Business
- A sequence may be taken in one of the following areas: social studies, science, math, language, music, art or occupational education.

## Sequence Options

- A sequence of 3 credits in 2 subject areas.
- A sequence of 5 credits in one area

*Occupational Education equals technology, business, agriculture, early childhood education and Questar III Career and Technical programs.*

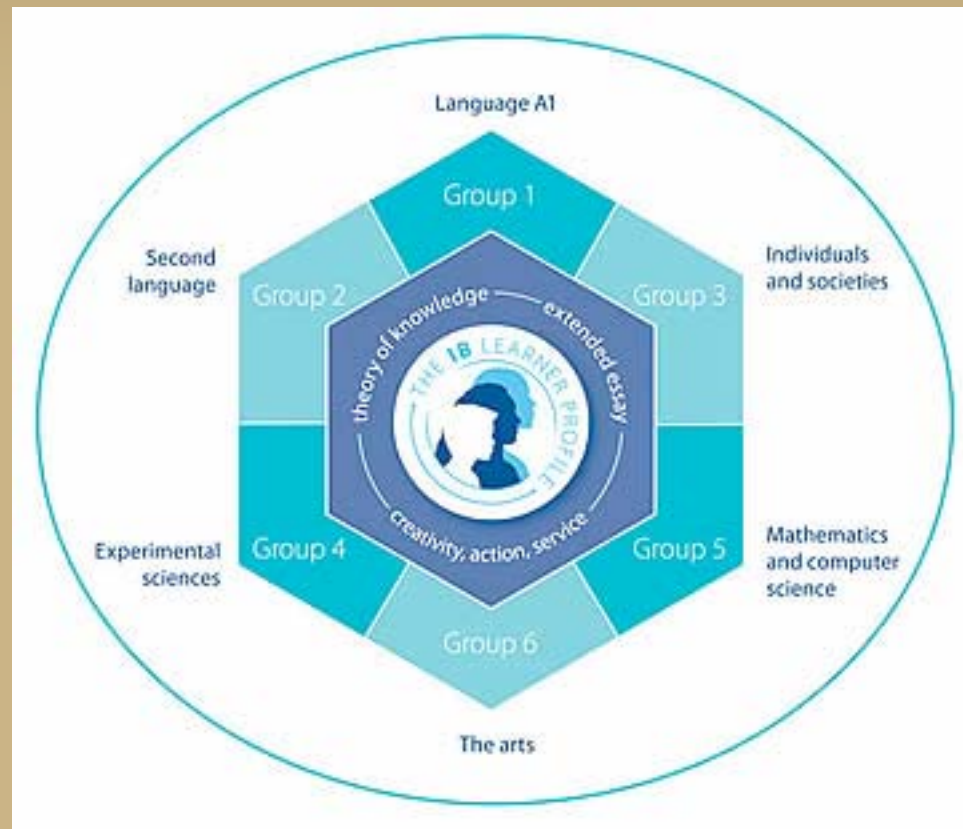
